WARSAW (UPI)---POLISH NEWSPAPERS REVEALED TODAY THAT AT LEAST FOUR PERSONS WERE SENTENCED TO JAIL TERMS FOR THEIR PART IN LAST WEEK'S CLASHES BETWEEN POLICE AND STUDENTS. ONE NEWSPAPER BLAMED THE TROUBLE ON JEWISH YOUTH.

THE PARTY NEWSPAPER TRYBUNA LUDU SAID, HOWEVER, THAT "A FEW SCORE" OF PERSONS WERE SENTENCED TO DETENTION OR FINES BY THE COURTS. IT SAID HALF OF THEM WERE NOT CONNECTED WITH THE UNIVERSITY.

THE SOCIALIST YOUTH NEWSPAPER SZTANDAR MLODYCH SAID OF NINE STUDENTS PICKED UP BY POLICE, THREE WERE JAILED FOR SIX MONTHS AND ONE FOR FOUR MONTHS FOR INSULTING STATE AUTHORITIES. FIVE OTHERS WERE BEING HELD FOR INVESTIGATION, THEY SAID.

INFORMED SOURCES SAID 10 STUDENTS WERE GIVEN SIX MONTHS EACH IN SUMMARY PROCEEDINGS ON FRIDAY AND THAT AROUND 30 LAWYERS VOLUNTEERED TO DEFEND THEM FREE OF CHARGE.

THE CATHOLIC NEWSPAPER SLOWO POWSZECHNE SAID "ZIONISTS IN POLAND WANT TO TURN INTELLECTUALS AND YOUTH AGAINST THE PRIMARY DEMANDS OF PATRIOTIC RESPONSIBILITY FOR PEOPLES' POLAND."

THE PAPER GAVE A LIST OF NAMES SUCH AS "BLUMSTEIN" AND "RUBENSTEIN" AND SAID "THESE PEOPLE... WANTED TO DISTURB LINKS BETWEEN THE COMMUNITY AND THE PEOPLES' AUTHORITY."
