

WARSAW, MARCH 10 (UPI)-- THE TWO DAY BATTLE BETWEEN WARSAW STUDENTS AND POLICE IS THE RESULT OF A DILEMMA FORCED UPON THE GOVERNMENT, WESTERN OBSERVERS SAID TODAY.

THERE WERE FEW INDICATIONS THERE WOULD BE A NEW DAY OF CLASHES BETWEEN STUDENTS AND TRUNCHEON-WIELDING POLICE TODAY BUT STUDENT SOURCES SAID THEY ARE ALMOST CERTAIN TO CONTINUE MONDAY UNLESS SOME EFFORT IS MADE BY OFFICIALS TO DISCUSS STUDENT DEMANDS.

THE STUDENTS DEMONSTRATED FRIDAY AND SATURDAY BASICALLY AGAINST THE EXPULSION OF TWO STUDENTS FROM WARSAW UNIVERSITY BECAUSE OF THE PART THEY PLAYED IN A DEMONSTRATION AGAINST THE CLOSURE OF AN ANTI-RUSSIAN PLAY ON JAN. 30.

THE 19TH CENTURY CLASSIC DZAI DY (FOREFATHERS EVE) CONTAINS SUCH ANTI-RUSSIAN LINES AS "MUSCOVITES RULE OVER US" AND "RUSSIANS HAVE BEEN SENDING HERE FOR 100 YEARS FOOLS, SPIES AND JACKASSES."

ENTHUSIASTIC AUDIENCE REACTION TO LINES SUCH AS THESE BROUGHT A PARTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE ORDER TO CLOSE THE PLAY.

OBSERVERS SAID THAT ALTHOUGH THE GOVERNMENT COULD NOT AFFORD DEMONSTRATIONS AGAINST THEIR POLICIES OR DECISIONS, NEITHER COULD THEY AFFORD SUCH CLASHES AS HAVE OCCURRED DURING THE PAST TWO DAYS.

THEIR OTHER ALTERNATIVE WAS TO MEET THE STUDENT DEMANDS WHICH WOULD BE EQUALLY, ALTHOUGH PERHAPS NOT AS OUTWARDLY, DAMAGING TO THEM, THE OBSERVERS SAID.

IT APPEARED FROM THE SHOUTS OF SATURDAYS DEMONSTRATORS -- "FREEDOM", "DEMOCRACY" AND "GREETINGS TO OUR CZECHOSLOVAK BROTHERS" THAT THE DEMONSTRATIONS WERE FOR SOMETHING MORE BASIC THAN JUST A CHANGE IN THE PARTYS CULTURAL POLICY.

THIS WAS EMPHASIZED WHEN POLICE CHASED AND BEAT STUDENTS WITH TRUNCHEONS AND THE CRIES CHANGED TO "GESTAPO" AND "BANDITS" AND SOME BYSTANDERS WERE HEARD TO SAY "THIS IS WORSE THAN UNDER THE GERMANS."

ALTHOUGH FRIDAY'S DEMONSTRATION WAS LARVELY CONFINED TO WARSAW UNIVERSITY, BY NOONTIME SATURDAY IT HAD ERUPTED AT THE POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY ACROSS TOWN, WHERE THE TECHNICIANS AND EXPERTS WHICH ARE TO PUT COMMUNISM INTO PRACTISE ARE TRAINED.

THERE STUDENTS PELTED POLICE WITH BRICKS AND THE POLICE USED TEAR GAS AND THEIR CLUBS TO DISPERSE THEM.

A NUMBER OF STUDENTS WERE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN DETAINED BY POLICE BUT ONLY TWO ARRESTS WERE CONFIRMED.

THE STUDENTS WERE ALSO CRITICAL OF PRESS REPORTS OF FRIDAY'S CLASHES AND AT BOTH UNIVERSITIES SHOUTED "DOWN WITH THE LYING PRESS." COPIES OF NEWSPAPERS WERE BURNED.
